- Appointing women to leadership roles of land administration so that they can be voices for the multitudes of voiceless women and girls.
- Development and implementation of mechanisms that will translate the affirmative action in the Gender Policy, Gender Equity and Equality Act as well as the National Lands Policy into land ownership women.

Unfortunately, women in Zambia are still faced with serious challenges acquiring secured land, in spite of the country having progressive policies and laws on paper. Even when they are offered land, the majority of women lack financial resources to develop it, and in the end the land is taken away from them and is offered to people with the financial means to develop it.

As we celebrate women today, we call upon the Government, the corporate world and investors to prioritize women's empowerment in their operations. This may be done through facilitating access to resources such as credit, agricultural inputs, tools, or technology. There is a need to support initiatives that provide training and capacity-building for women in sustainable land use and livelihoods.

By investing in the wellbeing, livelihoods and resilience of women and girls, together, we can make progress towards attaining a more inclusive, just, and sustainable world for all.
